



Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) Parent Advisory Committee 2014-15 Overview

Role & Purpose

Engagement with LCAP: The LCAP Parent Advisory Committee will complete a cycle of inquiry process with our LCAP and use achievement data and community input to make recommendations for the annual LCAP update on the 8 state priorities.

Review Documents as Required by the State: The LCAP Parent Advisory Committee will review the Parent Involvement Policy and the Consolidated Application for district Title 1 funding.

Meeting Structure

The LCAP Parent Advisory Committee will meet quarterly to complete their inquiry process:

November 12, 2014	Review of LCAP goals and metrics
January 21, 2015	Update on LCAP implementation and review achievement data
March 4, 2015	Review LCAP community engagement data
May 6, 2015	Adopt recommendations for LCAP amendments

Membership

Open to all parents to participate. Only elected members (28 parents, 4 from each electoral district) will vote on action items.

Sub-Committee

The LCAP Parent Advisory will convene one sub-committee, the LCAP English Learner (EL) Parent Sub-Committee. The sub-committee will report directly to the larger LCAP Parent Advisory. This subcommittee will be open to all parents, but only elected members can vote on sub-committee items (14 total, 2 from each electoral district).

The LCAP EL Parent Sub-Committee will specifically look at the EL section of the LCAP plan and make recommendations on that section. The subcommittee will meet during LCAP Parent Advisory Committee quarterly meetings.

Nominations for Membership

School Site Councils nominate one parent member as a LCAP Parent Advisory candidate on the school's "SSC Roster".

Elections

Elections will take place at the SSC Summit on Oct 25th, 2014. Participating SSC Parent members will break up into electoral districts, hear from their parent nominees (speeches), and vote for their 4 representatives (at least two of these will be representing English Learners).

Bylaws

The first official LCAP Parent Advisory meeting will take place on Nov 12, 2014. The elected parent members will adopt bylaws that will determine rules for future elections, establish communication rules with the subcommittee, and detail other governing practices.
